Please take notice that King's Daughters Medical Center (KDMC) and King's Daughters Integrated Practices (KDIP) have adopted and implemented a new administrative policy entitled *Accessibility to Healthcare for Individuals with Disabilities (Including Alcohol and Drug Addiction)*. Further, KDIP has implemented a new *Referral Process* policy. King's Daughters Outpatient Behavioral Medicine Clinic as a department of KDIP has adopted and implemented both of these policies.

These policies state that access to healthcare cannot be denied because an individual currently has or has a history of an alcohol or drug addiction, including Opioid Use Disorder.

If you believe that King's Daughters Outpatient Behavioral Medicine Clinic has failed to provide its services to a prospective patient based on an individual's disability, including on the basis of Opioid Use Disorder, they can contact the United States U.S. Attorney.
